Half of the aircraft which were diverted away last night, returned to-day in very bad weather conditions. 	2nd Day		<p>Remainder of aircraft which were diverted away on the night of the 30th, returned to-day just in time for briefing. 16 aircraft were detailed to attack HAMBURG, all took off and made successful attacks on the primary target. The bombing run done on P.F.P.'s sky marksmen, and no raid assessment was possible due to cloud over the target. All aircraft returned safely, but one aircraft landed at Winton due to a mistake. The pilot, L.14697, on his 10th operation back from Berlin, reported his engine on SCA dropped out 600' R/H/LK brand, who is now on the Squadron, mistook Winton for Thalthery while he was attempting to land. He was unable to land due to the heavy cloud and was unable to make a landing about waiting for his turn to land.</p>
