	2.3.45		14 aircraft detailed for an attack on Bologna. Attack was very unsuccessful. All returned to base except BB 79 - Pilot Flt. Lt. Henry who landed at Modigliani. Flt. Lt. S.P. Stevenson and crew were unscathed to-day.		
	3.3.45		None & Head, now air training was largely laid on. A.M. a signal received giving the following information: 120679 P/O F.E. Mitchell, Com. J.3405 S/L C.G. Hall, 179043 P/O W. Abbott, Com. R. 223415 Sgt. J.A. Bladie were all buried at Crathesay (Glas.). Also Com. R. 306412 Sgt. J.B. Lockhart now missing believed killed. All the above were in a crew missing on operations to Paris - July 18/19th, 1944. 14 aircraft detailed for operations - later cancelled.		
	4.3.45		14 aircraft were again detailed for operations, but just as Main Briefing was about to begin, word was received to stand by for operations and further instructions.		
	5.3.45		14 aircraft detailed for an attack on Chemnitz. All were airborne at 1632 hours. Spare crew P/O E.G. Tuckey (Z. 2756) went in place of P/O G.F. Mc Mill (Z. 2902) as the latter was taken off, due to illness just before take-off.		
	6.3.45		At 0845 hours all but one crew Z/O S.E. Reid (Z. 3069) had returned safely to base. Flt. Lt. D.G. George (Z. 1257) was slightly wounded by flak before reaching the target, but after bombing brought his aircraft back to base.		
	7.3.45		16 aircraft were detailed for a raid on Dusseldorf, all airborne at 1635 hours. Prior to take-off, pilots were briefed to land at Rommelsdorf on their return to this country. All our aircraft landed safely at Rommelsdorf. One aircraft BB 77 ED 502 Pilot P/O J.P. Engen (Z. 3057), was damaged by flak. It was left at Rommelsdorf, the crew returning to base in another aircraft. All were down at 1800 hours.		
	8.3.45		19 aircraft were detailed for operations, which was later scrubbed.

Grafton	11.3.45		P/O J.R. Williams, missing on opn 16th July, 1944 (Gn.J.90374) to Paris, is now presumed killed on that date. 15 aircraft detailed for a daylight raid on Basra. They were airborne at 1130 hours. U/Odr. R.F. Davenport (G.100) and crew in aircraft 2A KB 853 failed to return. The remainder of the crews were down at 1202 hours.		
	12.3.45		15 aircraft raided Dusseldorf in daylight. 10/10ths cloud prevented accurate assessment of the raid. Only light flak was encountered and all our aircraft returned safely.		
	13.3.45		Operations called off later scrubbed. Training flights only. Gn.J.9532 S/Idr. H.M. Smith (B.W.) (Pilot) assumed temporary command of the Squadron, pending posting of a new Squadron commander. The following were screened from further operations to-day: Flt. Lt. R.G. Trotter - P/O P. Williams - P/O I.D. Wooff - P/O J. Prishewski - P/O J.V. Dempsey P/O V.H. Shand.		
	14.3.45		Word received that Gn.J.88604 P/O A.M.G. Munro (4/B) who was missing 25/26th February, 1944 on a mining operation in the Baltic Sea is now presumed dead. Gn.J.20059 P/O R.E. Garton (Nav.) who went missing on 16/17th June, 1944 on a raid on Stuttgart is now presumed dead. At the usual morning conference at 0930 hours, after the Met and Intelligence gen had been given out, the Squadron voted a sum of money (approx.) toward a party for the ground crew. Section Leaders are already busy collecting this sum. 14 aircraft took off late in the afternoon for a successful raid on Dusseldorf - there was little cloud and only a slight ground haze. The timing on the target was excellent and little or no opposition was encountered. All our aircraft returned safely.		
	15.3.45		15 aircraft from this Squadron participated in a night raid on Regia. The weather was clear over the target and the results were considered most satisfactory. Light flak only was encountered but enemy night fighters were out in force and followed the stream from the target area back to England. 14 of our aircraft returned safely, the Squadron suffering the sad loss of Gn.J.88601 P/O H.E. New (2) and crew. This popular skipper had 34 trips, 122 points and 205 operational hours to his credit.

	22.3.45		All our aircraft returned from a successful raid on Berlin. One aircraft R.A.F. 832 H.E. "H" with G.M. 220285 P/O F.G.M. Sommerville of the Squadron was hit by a 200 lb. dropped by a friendly aircraft. The bomb took a large hole in the Port wing just behind the port engine. Through expert airmanship, P/O Sommerville managed his aircraft back to base and effected a safe landing.		
	23.3.45		G.M. 20707 P/O W.H. Wilson and G.M. 20305 P/O J.A. Geddes, missing on 9/10th May, 1944 after operations are now presumed killed on 9th May, 1945. G.M. 20205 P/O E.L. Gunning (A/B) returned from further operations to-day. 14 aircraft were called for operations. Four aircraft had taken off - a 4th Squadron aircraft missing and crashed, and due to the damage suffered when the 4,000 lb bomb exploded, and the rest of the take-off was abandoned. Our 2 aircraft landed successfully. There was no cloud and only light risk and the raid was considered successful. One aircraft R.A.F. 832 H.E. "H" with G.M. 220274 P/O J.V. Baggen and crew failed to return. This Pilot had 32 trips, 124 points, and 220.14 hours. The remainder of our aircraft returned safely.

			The squadron has had a fairly uneventful month, though conditions have been a little troublous. Change in command and several new active flyers, and a somewhat increase in flying hours. Month is high and efficiency appears to be the best.
